It is hard to believe that another month has come and gone! Things have been interesting, as always, here. There is really no way to explain it other than inviting you to live here for a few months. Katrina has successfully applied for her temporary residence renewal. All of the paperwork is finally done and all we have to do is wait and pray.

We are thankful for the weekly opportunities to give Bible lessons each Saturday at a children's home. For me, especially, it has been a great way of using the Russian language for the purpose I am learning it - to reach people with God's Word.

Thank you for praying about the ACT test in Kiev. Everything went according to plan and I was even able to visit and fellowship with some brothers in Christ that Sunday. Now we hope that both the university and the Ukrainian Ministry of Education will accept the results of the test and make official all of the credits I have earned. But even if they don't, I am thankful for the chance to study Russian.

In the works is an update video to be shown on furlough. We made an initial version for a supporting church in Ohio and I will be making the final edition available to all of our supporters in a few months. Planning is currently underway for visits to the Northeast predominately as we make the most of the little time that we have in the United States. Please pray for wisdom as the due date for Baby #3 falls right into the middle of traveling and reporting.
